## Principal's Pen



**“Be aware of wonder. Live a balanced life - learn some and think some and draw and paint and sing and dance and play and work every day some.”**

Last week I was fortunate to join approximately 100 Catholic School Principals for the Bi-Annual Conference in Mackay. The theme of the conference was **“Head, Heart and Soul – Creating the Balance”** The quote I share with you above was one that was used to illustrate that **in life we need to be more aware and conscious of what we choose to fill our days and time with – what we prioritise.** We can very easily fill out lives with ‘stuff’ and be constantly ‘over busy’ and lead ourselves down the track of extreme stress which leads to increased chances of physical and mental illness. Our children pick up on this and too, are more prone to episodes of stress and anxiety if they see it in their parents. **We owe it to ourselves and our children to strive for that balance, with their need for time to connect with us at the top of the priority list.**

For me, it was a timely opportunity to stop and re-evaluate what I choose to prioritise in my life and how it effects my children – sometimes we come up with answers we don't like! Work is essential and is very important but **we should be working to live and not living to work!**

Maggie Dent, author, educator and parenting and resilience expert offered some very practical tips for us all that I'd like to share with you here: She proposes **7 Steps To Living A Life Full Of Significant Moments**

1. Feed your own passions. Do what you really love doing... those things where you can forget who you are.
2. Choose your thoughts and words very carefully – once said they can never be taken back.
3. Stay present and live in the moment. Pause and really celebrate small, special moments. Every day above the ground is a bonus!
4. Be grateful and thankful.
5. Lighten up and laugh often. Don't take everything so seriously or personally.

6. Feed your won spirit and strengthen your own world. There is so much power in 'pause' and learn the art of 'linger'
7. Simply be kind to others. Don't assume things of others.

### NAPLAN – ST RITA'S IN THE TOP 10 OF THE REGION

A reminder that NAPLAN testing is on next week – Tuesday 15 – Thursday 17 May. Students have been undergoing some additional preparations for the testing, however continual good teaching and learning in all year levels, as well as what parents do at home, contribute to outcomes.

You may have seen last week in the Cairns Post that St Rita's, Babinda was ranked 6<sup>th</sup> in the Far North region. This has been averaged over the past 4 years and is based on NAPLAN results as well as consideration of attendance rates, teaching staff and capital expenditure. This is a great achievement for St Rita's and is credit to the school staff and parents.



However, we cannot lose sight of the fact that as a Catholic School, **we value the education of the 'Whole Child'** and we know that NAPLAN is just a snap shot in time and has many deficits – it doesn't give you a true indication of how a child is really achieving – only a teacher in possession of much more comprehensive data can do that.

"These results are very pleasing and a credit to the hard work of our students and teachers with support from their families. However, NAPLAN results should be kept in perspective. While important, they are only one measure of student achievement at a point in time." *Gerard Delaney – Queensland Catholic Education Commission*

### CLASSROOM PROFILING

**In our commitment to ensuring high quality teaching and best practice in building positive classroom culture**, our teaching staff will engage in a process of classroom profiling this week. A profiler will be spending time in the classrooms gathering data which will be fed back to the teachers, giving them a snapshot in time of their classroom. This data is then collated and a School profile provided back to the staff. From here, we then set goals for areas for improvements as well as celebrating areas we are doing well in. This coaching is a most effective way to support teachers in engaging in best practice.

As we move into this busy week, let's take some of Maggie Dent's advice and do something you really love doing (or at least plan to do it!)

## APRE/SEL News

Today Year 2/3/4 celebrated Class Mass together. The focus for the Mass was 'Jesus is Risen!', and the reading was the story of Doubting Thomas. Whilst preparing for Mass last week, our class were discussing the ways in which Jesus was with us – even if we couldn't physically see him. A big concept for children! However, the children quickly understood and discussed that Jesus was evident in our lives through the actions and thoughts of the people here on earth today. They gave examples of kind and loving acts people had done for them, and how this was Jesus being present in their life today.

What I was most impressed by, and found to be one of those 'moments' was later that afternoon we were engaging in a Social and Emotional lesson focusing on our school's core values. As a group, we were looking at how the 'Famous Five' rules supported our school in living out the values of Community, Faith, Respect and Learning. As adults, we can find the value of Faith a difficult one to articulate clearly... however the children in Year 2,3,4 very quickly drew connections between the Religion lesson earlier in the day and the lesson about our rules and values. "That's easy" one child responded when being asked how keeping your hands and your feet to yourself could be an example of Faith. "When we treat others nicely, we are showing Jesus here today".


