As we head into week 5, I am conscious that the steam train heading towards the end of the school year is picking up pace. Students have been applying themselves well and working hard in class and in the playground and teachers have begun the process of assessing and gathering data on students in preparation for Semester 2 Reports.

In keeping on setting the children up for success here are some friendly reminders:

- Sleep: ensure your child is getting to bed early and getting enough sleep
- **Diet:** fresh is best! Avoid foods high in sugar. Send only nutritious food to school. (A reminder that lollies, chips etc are not permitted) High sugar is detrimental to learning, energy levels and mood. **Only send water to school**
- Speak Positively: maintain positive talk about school and learning, celebrating achievements and noting areas to strive to improve in
- Arrive to school on time. Students who are here on time, start the day off in a positive and organised way. Lateness is disruptive to learning.
- Down Time: ensure that your child has some 'unprogrammed' time in their week where they can simply chill.

music education in our schools and helped make the call for more of it! Thanks to everyone who took part."



SCHOOL FEE PROCEDURES

Some general information about school fee collection... This is an issue that was discussed extensively at the recent Principal's Conference and the processes are being tightened up across the Diocese.



Parents who pay their school fees by the due date help keep the school budget online and

balanced. Fee payment also enables the school to be able to pay for educational activities and resources such as swimming, gymnastics, headsets etc covered in the Curriculum Levy. Thank you parents for making this a priority, especially in these tight financial times.

Those parents who have capacity to pay fees but choose not to communicate with the school about fees by the due date (14 days from the issue of statements), cause the rest of the community to have to 'carry' their child's education. We all forget from time to time and the school understands this. However, parents need to understand that unpaid fees and levies can result in end of Semester Reports being withheld until such times as the issue has been satisfactorily addressed. If this continues over time, then enrolment can be jeopardised.

It is also helpful to know that enrolments into Catholic Secondary Schools or other Primary Schools are not accepted until a clearance of fees is shown from the Primary school. If payment of term fees cannot be made then there are very supportive processes that can be offered to assist parents in difficult times

INCREASE GOOD FEELINGS AT HOME

Leading Australian Family Expert, Michael Gross suggests "Strong families thrive on good feelings. They are not devoid of conflict or criticism, but generally strong families are pleasant environments to be part of.

One way to increase good feelings in your family is to increase the number of compliments.

As a general rule, the ratio of compliments to criticism should be around **five to one.** That is, there should be five times more positive, affirmative comments than negative comments.

In unhealthy families this ratio is reversed. When the ratio gets to around five negative comments for every one positive comment.


